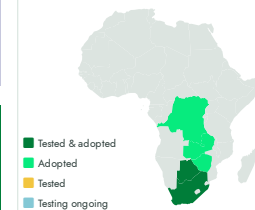

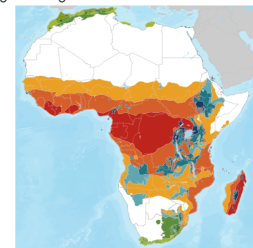

Problem

- Conventional fertilizers do not restore soil health.
- Nutrient losses reduce the impact of public investments.
- Soil degradation weakens productivity and resilience.

Solution

- Restore soil fertility beyond conventional fertilizers.
- Improve productivity and efficiency of public programs.
- Support climate-resilient agriculture.

Key points to design your project

Target areas and farming systems affected by soil degradation and low fertilizer-use efficiency.

- Promote soil testing and appropriate fertilizer recommendations.
- Train farmers and extension agents on integrated soil fertility management.
- Strengthen access to quality fertilizer products through effective distribution networks.
- Combine fertilizer use with improved seeds and climate-smart agronomic practices.
- Monitor productivity, soil health, and economic benefits to support scaling and policy decisions.
