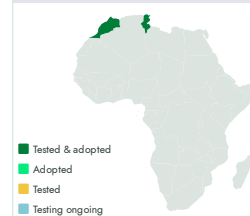

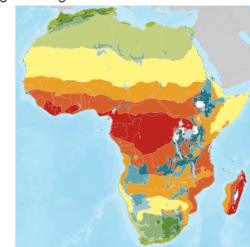

Target groups

Development institutions, Farmers, Governments, Banks and lenders

Problem

- **Limited community participation:** Limited opportunities for rural and marginalized communities to express concerns and participate in decision-making.
- **Gender and social barriers:** Restrictive norms and discrimination can limit women's participation and access to opportunities.
- **Limited collective problem-solving:** Conventional approaches may provide insufficient space for dialogue, solution testing, and collective action.

Solution

- **Community participation:** Engages rural and marginalized communities, particularly women, in expressing their experiences, concerns, and needs.
- **Addressing gender and social barriers:** Uses real-life scenarios and Forum Theatre to explore gender inequality, discrimination, and restrictive social norms.
- **Participatory dialogue and problem-solving:** Enables communities to discuss challenges, test solutions, and develop collective strategies for change.

Key points to design your project

- **Community participation and engagement:** Helps governments engage rural communities, particularly women and marginalized groups, in identifying challenges and expressing their experiences.
- **Inclusive dialogue and problem-solving:** Uses Forum Theatre to facilitate dialogue, test alternative solutions, and strengthen community participation in decision-making.
- **Gender-responsive rural development:** Supports government initiatives addressing gender inequality, restrictive social norms, and social barriers through participatory and community-based approaches.
